Vice Commodore Report - September

Recent Windycrest facilities maintenance, repairs and updates:

- A storm on the night of August 16 caused a dock at Gull Bay to break a mooring and swing into the Windycrest mooring field. Several boats were separated from their mooring balls and blown eastward into the cove, but there was no major damage. All boats retrieved and the dock was restored to it's original position.
- Bathhouse: Replaced a leaky sink faucet in Men's side as well as light fixtures in both Men's and Women's showers. New floor mats in front of sinks; routine cleaning.
- Progress has been made in efforts to dispose of derelict boats as Brent Swopes has hauled a couple away.
- · Blake Annis continues to keep the grounds looking well-manicured.
- A new motor for the work barge has been procured and installed. It's a long shaft 20hp Suzuki
 with electric start. The previous motor is only a year old and works well, but it was a short shaft
 and the prop could not stay in the water.
- Breakwater repairs: Yul Shaffer has determined that the small breakwater can be repaired to its
 old glory at a fraction of the cost of a replacement. Materials have been procured to fabricate 17
 new concrete panels that will hang on chains under the floating breakwater platform. Meanwhile,
 Yul will be repairing the steel framework. This is our major ongoing project.
- Four new refrigerators have been procured and installed to replace old ones that were broken or in bad condition. Three are in the pavilion and one in the maintenance shop. Blake Annis found someone to haul off the old ones for no charge.
- New "Water Valve" signs have been installed on the docks, behind the bathhouse and at the main valve near Windyrest.

MC Southwest Regional Championship Regatta

Easily the most competitive, largest and most travelled one-design regatta of the year for our club just concluded on September 15. The MCSW Regional Regatta is something I look forward to each year with anticipation about how many boats will we draw? From where? Will Dallas sailmaker (and recently crowned 2024 MC Nationals Champion) Bill Draheim and his crew Mary Anne Hopper attend? Will the weather cooperate? How will our fleet compare?

This year's event did not disappoint as we hosted sailors from seven different states (OK, TX, WI, TN, AR, MO, NE) combining to form a very competitive fleet of 18 MCs. The weather for this two-day event cooperated nicely with sunny skies, warm temps and E- SE winds around 5-13mph and bringing with it abundant wind shifts back and forth of 20-40 degrees. In fleet racing, these wind shifts "re-shuffle" the deck of cards so to

speak and create passing opportunities for everyone during the racing as the sailing angles change and gains are made by being "in-phase" with the shifts. What it also does is create stress for the Principal Race Officer (PRO) and their team to stay ahead of ever changing winds. Luckily, we had a superb one for this regatta as Skeeter Chilton and Asst. PRO Steve Elliott led the team of Dave Dolcator, Rick Martin and Jesse Martin, Jennifer Schultz, Nancy Keithline, Leah and Blake Kelso, Doug Lewis, Mike Beatt and Adam Kemmerly on the water. They represented the very best of race management for our club. Well done everyone!

If you've never witnessed one-design fleet racing like this before... you might consider helping in the future with an RC duty. Great, close racing with boats finishing overlapped, tight mark roundings,



capsizes, general (start) recalls and more happening steadily across seven races total during our two day event. With a front row seat at this event, you'll see and hear great RC work on the radio and on the water. Hats off to everyone on this RC team as they worked tirelessly to adjust angles of the starting lines, course angles and length, snappy flag-work and start-sequence timing.

It didn't take long for racers to notice the consistent speed and skills of eventual regatta winner John Harrop (San Diego Yacht Club), who just transitioned into MC action now from his home of Nashville. His sail trim was sharp, tactics and starts on-point as he cruised through the scoring with only 11 points. Windycrest was well represented with Drew Zeigler, Dan Jarret and Stephen Gent taking three of the top five spots with all of them sailing well. Nice job guys!

In third place, and returning for his second attempt to place at this regatta was Mike Schoendorf from Milwaukee. Perhaps what's interesting to note with many top-finishing sailors is the fact that each of them raced within their respective club's junior program. Mike and Bill Drahiem competed against each other in Lasers and the like in the Midwest (as kids)... and here we found them again facing off on our home waters at Windcrest... some 40 plus years later. Pretty cool.

Some MC regattas feature 50 to as many as 90 boats on the starting line, but even with 17 at our event there was no room to be on the second row as the starting horn sounded. We all pushed the line hard, creating several General Recall flags to go up as the RC could not call overearlies because of the crowd and the competition. The

shifty winds created good passing opportunities upwind. Downwind, the occasional puffs and corresponding lulls did the same as boats compressed at the leeward marks. All in all the conditions (which also provided very little powerboat traffic, which the locals noticed) were very nice and Keystone Lake did not let us down.

So, what happened to MC Nat's Champ Bill Draheim and his faithful teammate Mary Anne? They are perhaps "the face" of our MC class on the water and Bill has multiple titles to his name over the decades. They finished seventh in wind conditions that were shifty, and at times light throughout the weekend. I do know they viewed this regatta as a good "tune up" for the next big thing... the MC Masters National Championship coming in two weeks near St. Lous. Why did they remain a MC team of two (the only ones) when you can shed your crew (and weight) between races when the winds get light? Were they bringing their A-game or simply keeping the "rust" off of their game together in preps for the Masters Championship? We may never know, but their final standings caught many by surprise.

To you the reader.... In the end racing is racing. It's at the very core of our club's purpose and from where WSC was born. It is the measuring stick for us to see how we compare, paying rewards for hours spent in your boat. Events such as these are a high-point opportunity for anyone wanting to improve.

I'd like to offer this regatta summary to remind anyone who is looking to simply become a more efficient sailor, a better sailor, a well-rounded sailor... to join in our club's racing program and challenge yourself and learn new skills. If that's not your game, why not volunteer for RC duty throughout the year to get one of the best front row seats for our sport. Interested in trying an MC scow? The Windycrest MC Southwest Regional Championship is over for 2024. We had a great time both on the water racing and off during our Saturday evening dinner and morning coffee sessions catching up with old friends from across the county and meeting new ones. 
