Recent Windycrest facilities maintenance, repairs and updates:

- Problems with the water system continue. City Of Sand Springs called to alert us that there is a significant leak in our system; it has been determined that the leak is probably somewhere downhill from the valve by the bathhouse. Also, the shut off valve at the meter does not work; Sand Springs water department will fix it this week (week of Oct. 7).
- Gilley Electric came out to fix a problem with the wiring on B dock. They also discovered that the
 wrong size wire was used to rebuild the service to the dock. Talks are underway to arrange
 remedy to that problem.
- The motor on the Mako boat has been repaired and is working well.
- Work continues on rebuilding the Breakwater

The Flying Scot was inducted into the American Sailboat Hall of Fame in 1998. A look at the entire history of the boat and class starts with the designer, Gordon K. "Sandy" Douglass who announced the new design in the January 1957 issue of Yachting magazine."
