Rule 10.4 No race shall be started if the wind exceeds 30 MPH for Keelboats, and 20 mph for all other boats. Wind readings will be taken by the RC and considered over limits if readings exceed these limits for eighty percent of a ten-minute period. Races can be cancelled, abandoned or postponed at anytime for unsafe/excessive wind, heat, cold, storm conditions at the discretion of Fleet Captain or PRO on Duty. Class wind limits and fleet consensus will be considered at skippers meeting if extreme conditions are present or forecasted. Skippers are responsible for determining if conditions are unsafe for their crew.

Rule 19.1 RRS Appendix A, will be used to score series race days except as changed by these sailing instructions. High Point Scoring based on the highest number of starters of race will be used for Wednesday night and Sunday Series Daily Results. See 23.1 for Scoring series.

Rule 19.2 Discarded Races are allowed as follows for Spring, Summer and Fall series: If 9 or more races are sailed in a series, three discards are allowed; if 7-8 races are sailed, two discards are allowed; if 5-6 races are sailed, 1 discard is allowed; if 4 or fewer races are sailed, no discards are allowed.

Discarded races are allowed as follows for Wednesday Night Series: If 9-10 races are sailed four discards are allowed; if 5-6 races are sailed one discard is allowed; if 6 or less races are sailed, no discards are allowed.

Sunday Series shall have 3 races (30-45min target time) scheduled per day, 1 race minimum to score the day. A total of 10 race days are scheduled for the Season. Make up dates for canceled days will be rescheduled at the discretion of the Fleet Captain. Minimum of 7 race days to make a series, will score 6 best scores. See 23.1 for series scoring. Sunday Wave series will be on KB Sundays and CB Sundays when wind is over limit for MC Class

Wednesday night series will have a total of 12 races scheduled, best 6 races will be scored if 12-10 races are sailed, best 5 races scored if 9-7 raced, best 4 if 6 or less sailed.

Long Distance Races times, Start Style, Course Layout can be changed up to an hour before posted start time at the discretion of the Fleet Captain.

Rule 23.1 The overall Champion for each Class shall be determined by the High Point Scoring System as described in US Sailing Note on Scoring a Long Series at the end of Appendix A in the US Sailing edition of The Racing Rules of Sailing for 2021-2024. To Qualify, a skipper must sail in 60% of the Spring, Summer and Fall series races scored. One Throw out will be allowed. One additional throw out will be awarded for any skipper that sails in 80% of the Spring, Summer and Fall Series races.

The overall Sunday Series Championship and Wednesday Night Series scoring for each class will be determined by High Point Scoring for overall finishing position each race day. The winner of the day will receive points equal to the highest number of boats in class that started a race for the day, each position after will receive 1 pt less than place ahead, last place will receive 1 pt. Non entrants, OCS, DSQ will receive 0 pts.
